

Minecraft: How to Use Classroom Mode

Classroom mode is useful when students are connected to the same world as the teacher. Only the teacher needs to run classroom mode.

There are three main areas in Classroom Mode:

World Map

You can see where all your students are in the world map. Students' XYZ coordinates are at the top of this window.



Player Roster

You will see a list of the players inside your world here. It is color coded.

Chat Window

Chat with players and use slash commands.

In the upper left section of the world map, click on the three lines to access game controls. Move the slider to turn individual controls (listed in order from top to bottom in picture) on and off.

- Pause all players
- Disable chat for all players
- Perfect weather
- Allow mobs
- Allow destructive items
- Player damage
- Prohibits world modification
- Allow player damage to each other



Classroom Mode Controls

Map:

- Navigate by clicking and holding the map while moving your mouse. You can also scroll up and down with your mouse wheel to zoom in and out.
- Teleport all students to a specific area. Right click to teleport.
- Teleport a certain player to a certain area. Drag and drop.

Chat:

- Use the chat area to message players.
- Use the chat area for commands.
- Teleport using the command /tp.
