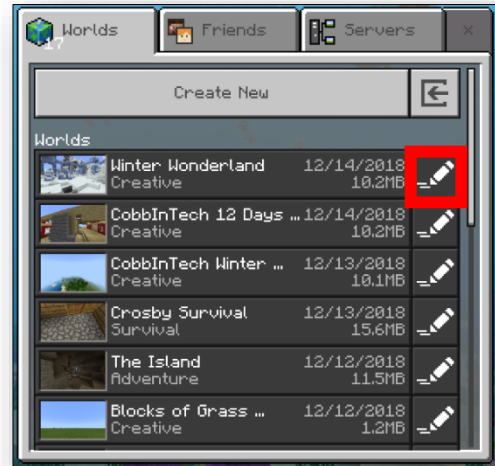


Tips for Using Minecraft with Students

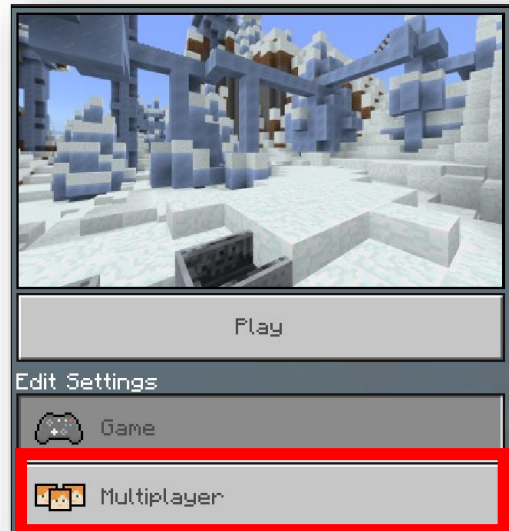
These directions contain tips for using Minecraft with students.

Using Multiplayer Settings

1. Launch the world settings by clicking on the **edit** button for the chosen world.



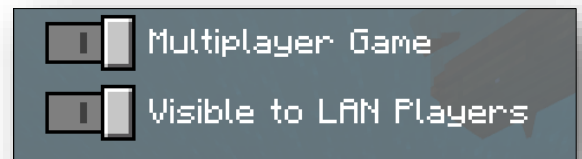
2. Click **Multiplayer**.



3. Select how you want to play.

Single Player Mode: Toggle Multiplayer Game to the off position.

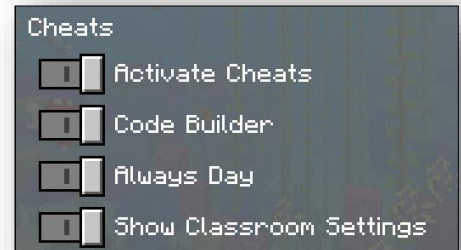
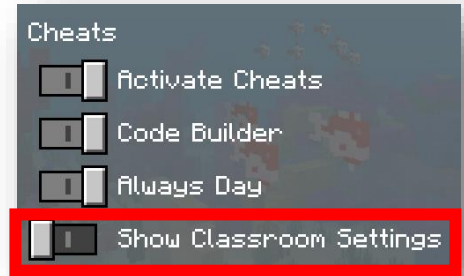
Multiplayer but shared by IP address only: Toggle Visible to LAN players to the off position.



Using Classroom Settings

1. On the main settings page, toggle the **Show Classroom Settings** to the on position.

Note: The default position for Classroom Settings is off.



2. Select the appropriate settings and toggle to the on position.

Perfect Weather – no precipitation

Allow Mobs – Friendly and non-friendly mobs are allowed in the game; Note: The default position for allow mobs is on.

Allow Destructive Items – Allows items like explosive TNT

Player Damage – Allows players to take damage from the environment and from mobs

Immutable World – Prevents the players from placing or destroying blocks

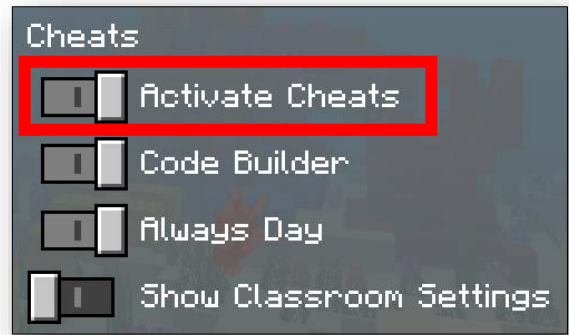
Player vs Player Damage – Allows players to cause damage to one another including friendly fire and intentional fire



Using Slash Commands

1. Toggle **Activate Cheats** to the on position.

Note: The default position for Activate Cheats is on.



2. Click **Play** to launch the game.
3. Type one of the following to activate the command feature:
 - Type the / key
 - Type T and then type the / key
 - Type enter and then type the / key
4. Type your command.

Some helpful commands:

/weather – Sets the weather

/immutableworld – Prevents players from placing or destroying blocks

/setmaxplayer – Allows the world creator to set a maximum number of players who can enter the world
